Sevenoaks Magical Mystery tour

Follow in the footsteps of the Beatles on our guided walks (start and finish at the Library).

Saturday 6 October 2007

10.30 - 11.30am and
12.30 - 1.30pm

The Beatles visited Sevenoaks on the 30 and 31 January and returned on 7 February 1967.

Parts of the Knole Park estate were featured in the promotional films of the pop songs *Strawberry Fields Forever* and *Penny Lane*.

Lighting, props and special effects were used to transform woodland, golf course fairways, ponds, a ruined archway and a dead tree into the surreal landscape of the Beatles' imagination.

On a break from filming, John Lennon browsed in an antique shop on the High Street. Its location is the biggest mystery on our tour. From the shop he bought a Victorian circus poster. Inspired by the colourful language of the poster, he wrote the song *Being for the Benefit of Mr Kite*. This is track seven on *Sgt Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band* album.
